Canon Deenihan was born in Blackpool in Cork City in 1967 and studied in St. Patrick's College in Maynooth He worked in the parishes of Schull, Kealkill and Bantry and taught in St Goban's College. He has a masters & doctoral degree in education and was appointed as diocesan adviser for post primary

catechetics in 2003. In 2006 he was named diocesan secretary and diocesan education secretary.

Canon Thomas Deenihan, will be consecrated as the new Bishop of Meath later today. He will replace Dr. Michael Smith, who submitted his letter of resignation to Rome three years ago. Speaking following the announcement of his new position, Canon Deenihan admitted to suffering many sleepness nights since he was informed of the pope's decision.

"There is an acute sense of being unworthy for the task, the enormity of the task and a deficit too in local knowledge - be it geography or personality," he said.

"I always had the view that the Diocese of Meath has a unified and a talented clergy and younger too than many other dioceses. That must be a blessing.

Canon Deenihan thanked Dr. Smith for his welcome, advice and leadership in the diocese. "Even for those of us outside the diocese, there was a sense about him of a father figure and a bishop who was close to his priests. I hope the same will and can be said of me when my time comes."

We look forward to having Bishop Deenihan in our parish and we wish him well in his role as shepherd of the Diocese of Meath.



Bishop Michael Smith was born on 6th June, 1940. He was ordained a priest in the Papal Archbasilica of St. John Latiran on 9th March, 1963. He celebrated his first Mass on 10th March, 1963 in the Clementine Chapel, located under the Altar at the Papal Basilica of Saint Peter.

He was born in Oldcastle, Co. Meath. Having studied for the priesthood at the Irish College in Rome, he was ordained a priest for the diocese on 9th March, 1963. Continuing his studies in Rome he earned a doctorate in canon law. He attended at 168 days of the Second Vatican Council.

Returning from Rome he served in the Cathedral Parish of Mullingar, as chaplain to St. Loman's Hospital and as secretary to the Bishop. He was appointed auxiliary bishop of the diocese on 17th November, 1983 and was consecrated on 29th January 1984. On the 13th October, 1988 he was appointed coadjutor bishop with the right of succession. On 16th May, 1990 he succeeded Bishop John McCormack.

For much of this time as Bishop of Meath he served as secretary to the Irish Bishop's Conference and was actively involved in Church matters. He was always well respected both by the people of his diocese and those in public life. Bishop Smith will retire as Bishop of Meath on 2nd September 2018. We thank Bishop Michael for his years of priestly service and his leadership in our diocese and we pray that God will grant him health and happiness in his retirement..


