'Lent 2021 has been a difficult challenge for all of us as the restrictions imposed on us meant that we couldn't come together in person. However we have tried via our webcam to encourage each other to journey together towards the celebration of the most important season in our Christian tradition. We joined in prayer with one another and also with Jesus as he moved towards his passion, death and resurrection.

The past twelve months have been very difficult for all of us. We have had to make many sacrifices, miss out on key moments and celebrations for the benefit of all. Covid 19 has taught us many lessons, for some of us it has made us value more those people and things that are important to us. For some of us it has allowed us to take a breath and realise we need to slow down. At the start of Lent we prayed that our journey through Lent would help to reenergise and refocus ourselves during the harshness of the level five lockdown.

This last Holy Week we waited in darkness for the light that will break into the world just as the sun starts to fade and we remembered that things often are not as they appear. Like the disciples broken by what seemed like defeat on the cross, we too are often broken by our own failures. We waited like Peter to be set free. "God's love for us is revealed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, who shared our human condition, with all its joys and sorrows. As his disciples today, we can have confidence in his promise to be with us always, even to the end of time".

As we prayed during the Easter Triduum we were conscious that Jesus walks the way of the cross with us and we interpreted in hope towards the love of sharing in his Resurrection which, one way or another, we calcurate together.

Easter takes place at a time of year which is filled with hopefulness. We have longer evenings and nature is bursting with hope and the promise of new life. And the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead brings that hope to a new level of reality. Far from the resurrection being simply a metaphor that religious people use for natural renewal, it is the yearly renewal of the Earth in Spring which is an anticipation of the resurrection; a sign pointing to something greater than itself. Optimism is cheerful. Facing reality is healthy. But hope is essential. The hope coming as a life lived in view of the dawn of Resurrection.

As Pope Francis puts it: "Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated this world. Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. It is an irresistible force."

Easter is a yearly invitation to lift up our hearts and keep on hoping against hope, contemplating in hope whatever signs of the resurrection we find around us, no matter how small or seemingly insignificant. We each have our own resurrection world opening up in, through and around us.

Covid is still with us this Easter. And though it is still night, morning is coming. Hope saves. Let us look out for the seeds of the new world being born out of Covid.

In the words of Pope Francis this week "Along the daily way of the cross, we meet the faces of so many brothers and sisters in difficulty: let us not pass by, let us allow our hearts to be moved with compassion, and let us draw near"
