18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It sounds all fair and reasonable, when a man, cheated by his brother over their share of inheritance places his case before the Lord, that he might help in the adjudication of the matter and restore justice. However, the Lord's response would have been the least of the petitioner's expectations: "Friend, who appointed me a judge or an arbitrator of your claims?" He goes on to admonish his audience against greed, in all its forms, as we read in the Gospel passage of today. Was the Lord being unkind to this petitioner? Not at all, since the words of Ecclesiastes open our eyes to the Lord's teaching on this occasion: "Vanity of vanities, all is vanity".

Vanity in Hebrew is hebel which literally means breath, and it is metaphorically applied to all things transitory, frail and unsatisfying. [The name Abel is rooted in the same word, which describes the young man whose breath was cut short by his murderous brother]. The Lord, in the passage, views human inheritance as *hebel*; it is transitory, frail and unsatisfying. Therefore, how can that which is transitory, empty and frail be the source of litigation and division between brothers? If the property in contention could not preserve the life of the original owner's, could it assure anyone else of eternity? Yet, human possession gives false sense of security to many who are deceived by it. For some, the more we have, the better life is. For others, it has become the source of many disagreements and disputes, either destroying or robbing their families and communities of their wellbeing and peace.

The Lord invites us, today, to take a long view of life and assess our own attitudes towards material gain and wealth. After all, when it is all said and done, what I have will not count, but who I am. What is my attitude towards the goods of this life?
