### Church opening

We celebrated Easter 2021 against the backdrop of over a year now since Covid 19 was thrust upon us. Our social, economic, work and family patterns have been battered. But we really are now entitled to start dreaming about the world beyond COVID. What have we learned from this COVID pandemic? What lessons do we want to bring forward out of it.

Life has been dramatically altered for everyone, we are fed up with lockdowns; it has meant been at home; working or not working, home-schooling or alone, in hospital or

nursing home. It is difficult hearing news of the high level of positive cases of Covid-19 and sadly of more deaths – our sympathies are with the grieving families.

The roll-out of the vaccines is welcome and offers hope? For many people it has been a time of challenge, a time to refocus and even make changes in our lives. This year due to lockdown has been all about re-setting the compass of our lives.

Many of us feel that we have been ignored by our political leaders despite our best efforts to comply with guidelines in providing a safe environment in our churches. Pope Francis pointed out recently that; 'the right to worship must be respected, protected and defended by civil authorities like the right to bodily and physical health'.

Lent gave us the opportunity to take stock of our lives and our relationship with God. Luckily our churches were open and many people could spend some time each day in silence, because all of us need to put at least some minutes of quiet into our day when we let God show us what is really going on.

Saying Mass in an empty church is something we have got used to but to know that we were joined by many of our parishioners as well as many others beyond the confines of our parish helped us to stay connected with God and his

So many of us are looking forward to Monday next - when we can gather together to celebrate Mass with our parishioners-The Eucharist is a great gift.

As Pope Francis said, we are meant to be "people of joyful hope, not doomsday prophets!" If we too discover the risen Jesus, we can all find hope and joy, and go out to share them with others. Jesus gave us real hope at Easter when he promised us "to be with us always" he assure us that we'll never be alone again.


