20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, we come across some of the most difficult sayings of Jesus: "I have come to bring *fire* to the earth". What fire is Jesus talking about? Or "do you think that I have come to bring peace? No, ... but rather division". These sayings of Jesus are considered difficult and hard to understand. How can the peacemaker and the Prince of Peace be the source of fire and division, we may ask? But as difficult and paradoxical this passage of today's Gospel may sound to the listening ear, it drives home the whole point about the entire mission of Jesus. Earlier in Luke 2, Simeon, that devout and pious man, had taken the baby Jesus in his arms and prophesized: "My eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all nations, the light to enlighten the Gentiles and give glory to Israel, your people". Simeon added: "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed..."

True to this prophecy of Simeon, the person of Jesus and his ministry had drawn many followers who believed in the truth of his Gospel and his offer of salvation. But there was also the camp that couldn't look the truth in the face; they hated and rejected him and his offer of eternal life. So, Jesus' presence had generated both love and hate; yet, this tension would not, in any way, stop him from accomplishing his life-giving mission. He had come to confront evil and the forces of darkness and death in order to lift broken humanity from its state of corruption and depravity to the presence of God. The fire that Christ kindles on earth is the uncompromising truth of his word that does not conform to the standards of the world. His fire warms that which is cold, purifies that which is impure and consumes that which is evil. This fire touches every aspect of the life of the disciple, and even, the very nerve of their most intimate of relationships. The truth burns, and the one who is uncompromising with it stands with Christ and shares in his suffering. This is a difficult task but, may God's people never grow cold to proclaim and live it, in and out of season!
