The Wedding feast at Cana in Galilee

There are three lessons that we can reflect on from today's gospel.

- 1. There is the changing of the water into wine indicating that lesus is human and divine.
- 2. Jesus attending a wedding and his willingness to help the young married couple.

- 3. We have the words of Mary, the mother of Jesus, who tells the servants:
- 'Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5)

The changing of the water into wine was the first of Jesus' miracles or signs as John calls them. Jesus is revealed as divine. All Jesus' miracles were signs by him pointing to his true identity as the Messiah. They were more than just acts of kindness and compassion. They revealed to the world who he was and why he came into the world. These signs of power and healing were glimpses of eternity. They invited people to repentance and conversion so that they could strive for a share in eternity.

We see Jesus attending a wedding feast and his kindness to help the young couple to avoid an embarrassing scenario. He did not abandon them in their hour of need and made a significant difference to their celebration. Similarly lesus is present in all our lives and relationships. He is the silent partner at every wedding and the silent guest in every home. All we need to do is to acknowledge him and trust in him so that he can lead and guide us too on our journey through life.

Finally we have the few but important words spoken by Mary his Mother. Her advice is as relevant to each of us today as it was at Cana. "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5). Mary who is our Mother offers us the same advice. She encourages us to listen to lesus and follow his advice by living our daily lives as his followers.
